Pentecost is Coming!

I don't usually write about a June event in the May newsletter, but the Feast of Pentecost falls on June 4, 2017 and the Vestry and I wanted to make sure the whole congregation is aware that we have a special event planned for that day. Pentecost is considered the "Birthday of the Church" and we plan to have a multicultural, multilingual birthday celebration on that day.

On Pentecost we will unite our 10:30 a.m. English Service with our 12:30 p.m. Spanish Service for a bilingual celebration. This is right and proper because on the Day of Pentecost the Holy Spirit was poured out on the Apostles to give them the power to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to all nations. Indeed, the Gift of Tongues manifested today was not

"glossolalia" that is, the gift of an unknown spiritual tongue for personal edification but "zenolalia" the gift of a human language not learned by normal means but granted as a miraculous gift so that the Apostles could glorify God and proclaim Jesus to foreigners visiting Jerusalem in their own native languages. How fitting it is that as a congregation we are trying to live into the vision that the Gospel is for all people in all places. Our congregation is multiracial and multilingual. We proclaim Jesus to all and everyone we can that God is love, which God revealed his love in the death and resurrection of Jesus and that forgiveness of sins, strength for living and the hope of eternal live are offered to all who trust in his name.

The service will be held at 10:30 a.m. and immediately after the service, we will have a fiesta. If the day is nice and sunny, as we pray it will be, we will have a picnic on the lawn outside the church. If it is damp and rainy, as it could be, we will hold the celebration in the lower hall. The Vestry will provide BBQ Turkey (Richard Davis does this) drinks, rolls, Cole slaw and paper goods. We are asking our Latino and Latina members to bring a Tres Leches cake, Tamales and other homemade Mexican dishes. We are asking our English speaking members to potluck sides and desserts to bring share.

Historical Discovery about the **Church of the Holy Innocents**

While we know that most of the Stained Glass Windows in the nave of the church are by Myer of Munich, the origins of the windows around the altar and the font remained a mystery. Miss Claudia Hunter's history of the parish indicated that while they were believed to be of English origin the name of the designer was unknown. While I was at the Bicentennial Celebration for the Diocese of North Carolina, I bumped into a friend of mine, Ellen Weig. She is a church historian and one of her special interests is stained glass windows. We talked about the fact that the origins of some of our windows remained unknown.

I received an email from Ellen within about 24 hours of our conversation. In an online version of the "Henderson Gold Leaf," one of the predecessors of the Daily Dispatch, she found an article from December 19, 1889. That article identified the maker of the earliest windows in the parish as Messrs. Lavers & Westlake of London.



It appears they created the windows around the altar and the Seven Sacrament window over the font. Lavers & Westlake may have done the Resurrection Window in the transept opposite the font but that is not as certain as there are stylistic differences.

As a lover of church history in general and the history of the Church of the Holy Innocents in particular, I am thrilled to have this information. Special thanks to my friend, Ellen Weig. †

- Colorful buttons of various sizes
- Green 26-gauge floral wire
- Wire cutters


What you do:

- 1. Stack three buttons from largest to smallest, with the smallest on top. Align the button holes.
- 2. Cut 8 inches of wire.

 Thread it up through one hole of the stacked buttons and back down through another hole.
- 3. Twist the wire just below the bottom side of the button stack to secure it.
- 4. Insert the "flower" in the plant's soil and repeat the process.
- 5. Present this to Mom and wish her a happy Mother's Day!





The Deacon's Bench

Easter the day is past, but not the season of Easter, that lasts for days yet. We, however, don't seem to realize that Jesus is not done yet and those are the stories that we will hear right on up to the day of Pentecost. As we go forward we, along with the disciples, are shown the power of the Resurrection not only in the rising from the dead but also in the building of faith. Below are a few lines from the great author Frederic Buechner.



The Resurrection:

"WE CAN SAY THAT the story of the Resurrection means simply that the teachings of Jesus are immortal like the plays of Shakespeare or the music of Beethoven and that their wisdom and truth will live on forever. Or we can say that the Resurrection means that the spirit of Jesus is undying, that he himself lives on among us the way that Socrates does, for instance, in the good that he left behind him and in the lives of all who follow his great example. Or we can say that the language in which the Gospels describe the Resurrection of Jesus is the language of poetry and that, as such, it is not to be taken literally but as pointing to a truth more profound than the literal. Very often, I think, this is the way that the Bible is written, and I would point to some of the stories about the birth of Jesus, for instance, as examples; but in the case of the Resurrection, this simply does not apply because there really is no story about the Resurrection in the New Testament. Except in the most fragmentary way, it is not described at all. There is no poetry about it. Instead, it is simply proclaimed as a fact. Christ is risen! In fact, the very existence of the New Testament itself proclaims it. Unless something very real indeed took place on that strange, confused morning, there would be no New Testament, no Church, no Christianity.

Yet we try to reduce it to poetry anyway: the coming of spring with the return of life to the dead earth, the rebirth of hope in the despairing soul. We try to suggest that these are the miracles that the Resurrection is all about, but they are not. In their way they are all miracles, but they are not this miracle, this central one to which the whole Christian faith points.

Unlike the chief priests and the Pharisees, who tried with soldiers and a great stone to make themselves as secure as they could against the terrible possibility of Christ's really rising again from the dead, we are considerably more subtle. We tend in our age to say, 'Of course, it was bound to happen. Nothing could stop it.' But when we are pressed to say what it was that actually did happen, what we are apt to come out with is something pretty meager: this 'miracle' of truth that never dies, the 'miracle' of a life so beautiful that two thousand years have left the memory of it undimmed, the 'miracle' of doubt turning into faith, fear into hope. If I believed that this or something like this was all that the Resurrection meant, then I would turn in my certificate of ordination and take up some other profession. Or at least I hope that I would have the courage to."



Thanks be to God! Scott's surgery went exceptionally well and proved to be much less invasive that was expected. 


