

# So many things for which to Give Thanks

November is always a month in which we are called to give thanks. Americans have celebrated thanksgiving in November at least since the dark days of the American Civil War when Abraham Lincoln decreed a national day of Thanksgiving in the midst of the bloodiest conflict in the history of our nation. Prior to that Americans held, according to local custom, days of thanksgiving in the autumn, first in Virginia by members of the Church of England at Berkeley Hundred on December 4, 1619 and then later at Plymouth Plantation in Massachusetts in November of 1621. In both cases the settlers were continuing the European custom of offering thanks to God for the safe completion of the fall harvest. The

native peoples of the Americas also had a custom of giving thanks to God when the corn harvest was safely stored against future need. From the time of the Civil War to our own day, the president has designated a Thursday in November for the people of our nation of give thanks for God's continual mercy and provision for our necessities.

This year is also the hundredth anniversary of the Armistice that ended the fighting in World War One. Though negotiations leading to a peace treaty would continue for six months, the actual fighting stopped by an agreed armistice in November 11, 1918, the famed 11/11/18. World War One literally shaped the world in which we live. During that War, Russians, weary of the brutal conflict, held not one but two revolutions. One ended the Tsarist monarchy to be replaced by a short lived attempt at democracy while the second the Communists resulted in overthrowing the democratic Duma and replacing it with a Marxist-Socialist dictatorship. In the Middle East, the Ottoman Empire of the Turks was dismantled by the French and the Modern Turkey, Syria, English. Lebanon, Jordan, Iraq and Saudi Arabia emerged from the defeat of the Turks and the Jewish People were promised a national homeland in Arab Palestine though this promise was not fulfilled If those names sound until 1948. familiar and bring to mind ongoing conflict, you are correct. The British and the French divided up the Middle East without regard for ethnic and religious divisions and promised Palestine to the Arabs who already lived there and the Jews who were seeking to renew their ancient nation. One author described what was done in the Middle East as the "Peace to end all Peace" and that seems to be true. The seeds were also laid for

the emergence of a dictator like Hitler because of the harsh terms imposed in Germany which left the country economically crippled and polarized politically. Did I mention the Austro-Hungarian Empire was also dismantled? This led to the creation of Austria. Hungary, Czechoslovakia and what would become Yugoslavia. Poland also regained its independence, reuniting the portions of the country that had been divided amongst the Prussians, the Austrians and the Russians in the 1790's. In many ways, the world as we know it emerged from World War One and conflicts in the middle east and the recent ones in the Balkans were in part of a result of decisions made then.

After reading that paragraph, would you agree that history is messy? Yet, our good God has not abandoned his people. Europe is mostly at peace. The Middle East remains a fountain of conflict yet there are people of good will working to find a just solution that allows Israelis and Arabs, Jews, Christians and Moslems to live in peace. The harvests are still safely brought in for the provision of our necessity and the care of those in need. People give of themselves to help rebuild after catastrophes like the hurricanes that have ravaged our nation and the earthquake and tsunami as well as the typhoons that struck South East Asia. As long as there are people who sincerely seek to love those in need wherever need is found around the world and help people rebuild their lives, we have cause to give thanks to God. God gives us strength, courage and wisdom to respond to a world in crisis. †

The Annual Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, November 18, 2018 immediately after the 10:30 a.m. service. Because the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese do not permit early or proxy voting one must be in attendance to vote for new vestry members. For this reason there will be no 8:00 a.m. service on November 18<sup>th</sup>.

#### Nominations to Serve on Vestry

Members of the congregation may nominate folks to serve on the Vestry. To serve on the Vestry one must be a confirmed communicant in good standing. That means one must have been confirmed in the Episcopal Church, received from another denomination, or transferred into the parish from another Episcopal Church or a denomination with whom the Episcopal Church is full communion (Evangelical Lutherans or One must also receive Moravians). communion three times a year and be donor of record (donations made in a way that the treasurer knows one has donated) to the parish within the last year. It is also necessary to ascertain that the person so nominated is willing to serve. While it is best to turn in such nominations before the annual congregational meeting, nominations may be made from the floor as long as the above requirement are met. †



I thought that since this issue of our newsletter would be out just before the upcoming elections that the following words of our Presiding Bishop were worth some reflection as we Christians go to the polls.




"I'm concerned when I don't hear other religious leaders standing up for immigrants in our country being treated with justice and decency. I'm concerned when I don't hear Christian leaders advocating vociferously for the reunification of parents and children at our borders."

"I'm concerned when I don't hear religious leaders advocating for children to be number one on the social agenda of this country. I'm concerned when I hear silence from religious leaders after the Ku Klux Klan and neo-Nazis marched through the streets of Charlottesville. I'm not hearing Jesus of Nazareth when I hear that silence."

"We as Christian leaders must speak up and bear witness to the values that we hold based on the teachings of Jesus. And when we fail to do so, we've failed to represent the Christian faith in the public sphere."
