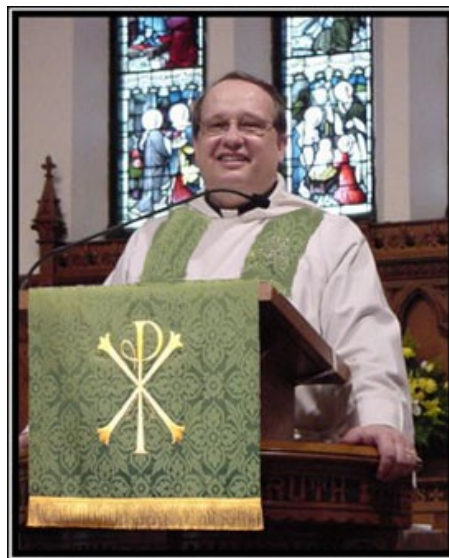

Some Things to Remember Now that Summertime is Here

Summer is upon us. While I know the official date for the beginning of summer is Wednesday, June 21 (with Holy communion at 5:30 p.m. to celebrate that event), for most Americans it really begins on Memorial Day Weekend. As I often do, I would like to remind folks of some important matters of consequence.



No matter where you go God is with you. Whether we are in the mountains or by the sea or at the lake in between, God is always near to us. No matter what continent our travels may cause us to visit, God is present. In fact, some of the most intensely spiritual places I have experienced have been overseas at holy sites commemorated by

generations of believers. If there is an historic church or shrine near your travels try to drop in say a prayer. If one is inclined to attend Sunday worship, and I encourage this, a simple google search of "Episcopal church and the name of the town" will often reveal a church, a website and service times. Don't be afraid to make yourself known to the clergy after the service. The Episcopal Church is small enough the local rector may well be a friend of mine. It also fun to worship in places different from home. I have been blessed to attend worship in Russian Orthodox churches and found it very moving. Just remember to show good manners and be respectful of the differences while soaking in a blessing.

Please remember that the cost of running Holy Innocents does not go on vacation. Bills and salaries must be paid. If you are not going to be in town and cannot drop off one's pledge at worship, please consider mailing it in to the office. If I might add a note of thanks, we rarely fall far behind on meeting budget during the summer. So this reminder is also a word of thanks for all you who are faithful in your support of the parish in all seasons of the year.



Are you scheduled to serve at a Sunday summer service and discover an opportunity to be away? Go for it! But please try to find a substitute. That is not always possible so please let the office or Father Don know. If we know folks are going to be away we can generally improvise. It is much more stressful to be in the sacristy minutes before service is to start wondering where an acolyte or reader is. Help us adapt to the needs of summer by informing the office of your travels. Father Don will pray for your safe travels, too!

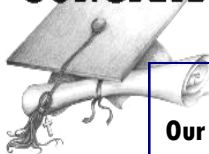

Changes, Challenges & Crisis: Remembering the Civil Rights Era in the Diocese of North Carolina, 1963-1973

You are invited to St. Phillip's Episcopal Church at 403 E. Main in Durham on Saturday, June 3, from 10 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for a retrospective on this important decade. Go behind the headlines of the General Convention Special Program, Malcolm X Liberation University, and the Black Panther Party's Free Ambulance Service. Consider the legacy of this era in our individual and corporate lives, and in our ongoing efforts toward racial reconciliation. Two groups of panelists, along with audience participants, will offer eye-witness accounts and reflections on their experiences. An optional tour of the Paul Murray Family Home at 906 Carroll Street will follow the program. This home was recently designated a National Historic Landmark and is the future home of The Pauli Murray Center for History and Social Justice. A registration fee of \$15 includes lunch. 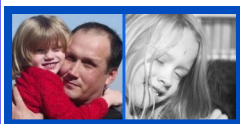
As the season of summer vacations begin I give you again more of the wisdom of one of my favorite authors, Frederick Buechner. Here Buechner reflects on the parable of the Good Samaritan.

“A Child or a Saint

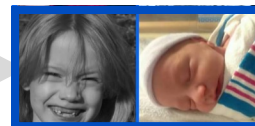
IN CHRIST'S PARABLE, a third man finally did come along, of course. He looked, really looked, and saw not just a man, but saw what was actually sprawled out there in the dust with most of the life whaled out of him. He bound up his wounds, set him on his own beast, took care of him, and his reward was to go down in fame as the Good Samaritan, which seems to be a marvelously inept title somehow, because just as I prefer to think of the priest and the Levite as less than really bad, more just half blind, in the same way I prefer to think of the Samaritan as more than merely good. I prefer to think that the difference between the Samaritan and the other two was not just that he was more morally sensitive than they were but that he had, as they had not, the eye of a poet or a child or a saint—an eye that was able to look at the man in the ditch and see in all its extraordinary unexpectedness the truth itself, which was that at the deepest level of their being, he and that other one there were not entirely separate selves at all. Not really at all.

Your life and my life flow into each other as wave flows into wave, and unless there is peace and joy and freedom for you, there can be no real peace or joy or freedom for me. To see reality—not as we expect it to be but as it is—is to see that unless we live for each other and in and through each other, we do not really live very satisfactorily: that there can really be life only where there really is, in just this sense, love. This is not just the way things ought to be. Most of the time it is not the way we want things to be. It is the way things are. And not for one instant do I believe that it is by accident that it is the way things are. That would be quite an accident.”
